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- 1 then -- and only the statute can limit voting rights,
- then the by-laws regarding attendance are invalid in
- 3 themselves.
- 4 The Law Society has a broad by-law
- 5 making authority, it has a broad subordinate
- 6 legislative authority which has been upheld in Supreme
- 7 Court decision recently in Trinity Western, and so I
- 8 don't see anything in the argument that's being put
- 9 forward and, with great respect, I don't share
- 10 Mr. Strosberg's view. Thank you.
- 11 TREASURER MERCER: Ms. Papageorgiou.
- 12 MS. PAPAGEORGIOU: So I want to talk
- about diversity. Diversity was a very big issue at the
- last election and I think that the governance reforms
- that began a few years ago are one of the reasons why
- 16 the group of benchers who have currently been elected
- is a very diverse group, but when you add in all of the
- 18 life benchers and the Treasurers, it is no longer a
- 19 diverse group, and that's important for a few reasons.
- There is a potential that there is a
- 21 dilution of the voices of the elected members of the
- 22 bench and probably a more significant implication is
- that former treasurers who were not elected, and I know
- this has been touched on before, have the ability to
- 25 swing an election.

- I don't see how that is right. Avvy Go
- 2 said -- there's been a lot of talk today about these
- 3 voices that we need and that somehow there's ageism.
- 4 There is no ageism in this organization against people
- 5 who are older; if anything, the ageism is opposite. We
- do not have a proper representation of younger
- 7 benchers, and, you know, when I look around this room I
- 8 wonder why that might be.
- 9 I know that when I was in my 20s, 30s
- 10 and early 40s, I would never have run to be a bencher,
- 11 and I think it's because of the composition of the
- 12 bench that existed. So I just think -- I don't know
- how you can attract people when the group is not
- 14 diverse altogether.
- 15 And just touching again on what Avvy
- said, there are a lot of voices that are actually
- 17 missing, important voices; the young people and also
- 18 people from the clinics. And I think we have a lot of
- 19 the voices that are represented by the life and the
- 20 former treasurers.
- TREASURER MERCER: Mr. Cooper.
- 22 MR. COOPER: Thank you, Treasurer. My
- 23 mentor, Ms. Leiper, who has assisted me in my criminal
- law career for, I don't want to say it, but more than
- 25 25 years and has given me great guidance, in 2011 when
